This course provides training focused on new instructor development skills for teaching Mississippi law enforcement and public safety officers, dispatchers, and corrections officers. Students will gain facilitation skills and an understanding of how to employ adult learning methodologies appropriate for various public safety topics. This course will guide the instructor on their role in teaching adults, classroom setup, and the use of equipment to support their students' learning. This class is designed for those teaching in-service or advanced training within their agencies, as well as instructors teaching in the academy setting. Once attendees complete an internship, they will be eligible to apply for their State of Mississippi Instructor Certification.
